

July 9, 2012

A **regular meeting** of the Kenilworth Board of Education **was called to order** at 7:30 p.m. by President Hector E. Colon, in the Board of Education Conference Room of the Brearley School on **July 9, 2012.**

This meeting is being held in accordance with the schedule of meetings adopted at the organizational meeting held May 7, 2012. **Adequate notice of this Regular Meeting** of the Kenilworth Board of Education has been provided to the Home News Tribune, The Star-Ledger, Cranford Chronicle and the Local Source. A copy has been filed with the Kenilworth Borough Clerk, posted in the Board Office, the Kenilworth Borough Hall, Brearley and Harding Schools, **as is provided by the Open Public Meetings Act.**

President Colon led the **salute to the Flag.**

In the absence of a quorum the Board continued with the meeting but will not take any action until quorum is achieved.

- Lillian Falcetano: Pre HSPA scores were incorrect and questioned when they were to be corrected. Mrs. Bush will check with the scoring company. Snack concerns at the elementary school and the need to monitor it regarding obesity. She also asked about stipends for coaching positions, how they are established. Mr. Hershey stated that they are negotiated with the Kenilworth Education Association. Several have been adjusted over the years.
- Mrs. Rappa: Concerned that the part-time positions are not being filled. Did the Board consider expanding the positions.
- Mr. Gagliardi stated that 15 years ago the UCRHS was dissolved and Brearley reopened under the control of the Kenilworth Board of Education. He stated that at the time many questioned the Board's ability to provide a quality education to its students. He stated the district should be commended for fulfilling its goal in providing a quality education to the students of Kenilworth.

WHEREAS, the opinion further provided that if the Board must invoke the Doctrine of Necessity not just to vote, but also to form a negotiations committee because it is without even three members to serve as a committee, then the Board must determine whether to act as a committee of the whole or to choose a smaller negotiations committee from among its members after stating publicly its reason for doing so as set forth above; and

WHEREAS, in keeping with the Legislative purpose as set forth in N.J.S.A. 18A:12-22(a) the School Ethics Commission views public disclosure of conflicts of interest to be paramount when it is necessary to invoke the Doctrine of Necessity.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1191 and Assembly Bill 3627 would remove a school board's option to subcontract services, thereby diverting funds from the classroom and burdening property taxpayers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Kenilworth Board of Education, **in its continued effort to provide cost-effective school operations to the community, opposes Senate Bill 1191 and Assembly Bill 3627;** and be it further
